The Society was founded in 1790 during the French Revolution. The outstanding characteristic of the Society, has been its ability to quickly respond to the changing needs of society. It is this spirit of openness, that enabled the Society to accept the invitation of the then Archbishop of Goa, to establish a teacher-education institution, soon after the liberation of Goa in 1961. The Nirmala Institute of Education was the only Teacher Education Institute in Goa for almost three decades and has contributed immensely to the development of school education during a crucial period in this nascent State. The Institute provided a solid foundation for the educational growth of Goa, through trained teachers who were employed in the schools, that were increasing at a rapid pace. It trained and nurtured teachers to shape and serve the new educational system in the State of Goa.</p>
